Dear WFDF members:

As you have been previously notified, the 2022 WFDF Congress will take place on Saturday, 23 July 2022 prior to the beginning of the WFDF 2022 World Ultimate Club Championships in Cincinnati on a hybrid (in-person and virtual) basis. I am hopeful that you and your association are managing through these difficult times and are seeing a return to "normal" in the level and breadth of your flying disc activities in your country. After two years of virtually no international competition, we are excited to be back hosting a full WFDF World Championship event calendar this year, and have been really happy with our first two big events this year with the WMUCC in Ireland and The World Games in the USA. We plan to host a small social reception for all Congress participants Friday evening starting at 6:00pm at the event hotel and our formal Congress meetings will be held from 8:00am to noon on Saturday.

Second there are a variety of presentations made to apprise you of our activities: reports from the President and Secretary General, the Census, WFDF sanctioned events, the disc sport committees, the work of the Commissions, development work, and anti-doping issues. For this year, we will be able to present these both in-person and in written form, and we have these final reports available in this update of the briefing book.

Finally, we like to encourage an open dialogue among the Members on various topics of interest. This year, we will set aside around 20 minutes to discuss "Challenges and Opportunities for Flying Disc Sports Post-COVID-19." We would encourage all members to share their thoughts on the challenges, coping strategies, and opportunities this global health crisis is creating. We plan a second discussion on the "Ramifications of the decision by LA28 on the short list of potential new sports." We look forward to getting your input on these and all matters during our session and encourage you to email us with any questions or concerns prior to the meeting so that we can address them efficiently.

WFDF 2021 Annual Congress 2nd Virtual Congress – Zoom Meeting Saturday, August 21, 2021 15:00 - 17:00 CEST

Call to order (15:05)

President Rauch welcomed the attendees to the 2021 WFDF Congress, the general meeting of all WFDF members. He expressed his gratitude for seeing so many participants from new and old member federations. Since COVID-19 was still affecting most gatherings, WFDF had to schedule this Congress again as an online-only meeting. With people joining from so many different time zones the meeting was scheduled for 2 hours. He apologized that there would be very little time for discussions.

Roll call of National Associations present & confirmation of votes allotted

2020 Congress Minutes (already approved)

Rauch presented the minutes of the 2020 Congress, which had been previously approved by Congress in an electronic vote.

Decisions taken by Congress between 2020 and 2021 Congresses

Congress had voted on the approval of new membership of Haiti Flying Disc (HFD, member #89), Association Malienne de Flying Disc (AMFD, member #90), Peru Ultimate (PU, member #91), Albania Flying Disc Federation (AFDF, member #92), San Salvador Ultimate Frisbee (SSUF, member #93), Greece Ultimate Frisbee Club Heraklion (UFCH, member #94), Kuwait Raptors (KR, member #95), Ghana Flying Disc Association (GFDA, member #96), Abuja Ultimate Frisbee Group (NIG, member #97), Malagasy Ultimate Disc League (MUDL, member #98), Serbian Ultimate Frisbee (RS, member #99), Frisbee Federation of the Kyrgyz Republic (FFKR, member #100), and the Professional Disc Golf Association (PDGA) as an associate member. The application of Palestine Flying Disc Association (PFDA) for regular membership was approved.

Other decisions included the approval of the Revised Budget for 2021 and a 50% reduction in 2021 Dues. At the end of 2020, Board member elections took place.

Report by the President



WFDF President Rauch reported that in the second year of the COVID-19 pandemic things were improving slowly. After canceling all WFDF events in 2020 WFDF took the decision in early 2021 to also cancel all events in 2021, with the exception of the European Team Disc Golf Championships (ETDGC 2021) in Croatia, which were being held at the time of Congress. Only larger sports federations and professional sports had been able to run events and reactivate leagues, mostly without spectators and huge efforts in testing for COVID-19. A number of countries are hosting national championships in the second half of 2021.

With the effects of vaccinations setting in, WFDF planned for 2022 to run the world events Beach Ultimate, Masters Clubs, Overalls, World Clubs, Juniors, Team Disc Golf and to attend The World Games.

For the second year in a row, revenues for most sports federations were down with WFDF expecting a decrease of around 90%. Just as other federations WFDF has also cut expenses drastically and expects to return to more normalized revenues by mid 2022. WFDF has tried to give its members some support by cutting dues by 50% for 2021.

Disc Golf is the only sport where activities have increased massively. Many athletes took up the sport and events could be restarted earlier than in other disc sports as an individual, outdoors sport. PDGA membership has risen to around 94,000.

WFDF is trying to maintain its activity levels despite new challenges due to the pandemic: athletes finding alternative pastimes, organizing bodies losing financial resources for their staff, and losing opportunities for growth and recognition, as the Olympics and other multi-sports games downsize and give priority to their incumbents. New and smaller members have difficulties to maintain their activities. But WFDF is excited about the large number of new members brought in during the last year.

Rauch mentioned WFDF's Seven Strategic Goals, per the Strategic Plan 2019-2024:

- 1. Promote the "frisbee lifestyle"
- 2. Pursue inclusion in the Olympic Programme and Other Multi-Sports Games
- 3. Support member associations in promoting youth development as path to growth
- 4. Build the audience by increasing the entertainment value of disc sports competitions
- Showcase Spirit of the Game as an essential element of disc sports
- 6. Ensure the well-being of our athletes and our sport and encourage gender equality and diversity in all aspects
- 7. Optimize organizational effectiveness and efficiency

These goals remain the same but in light of the COVID situation over the last two years these would be looked into for any revisions needed.

Some high goals accomplished over the last year are the implementation of an athlete safeguarding policy and a standalone non-discrimination policy. On December 1st, 2020,



a new website had been launched. The former website had been used for 10 years and this major update is a vast improvement, especially being optimized for the rise of the usage of mobile devices. A fairly major revision of WFDF's bylaws had been worked on and went through a few iterations to be presented for approval at this Congress. The changes concern WFDF membership structure: provisional vs. regular member, voting rights, budgets, and the member transition phase.

WFDF's Women in Sport Commission had published a Gender Equity Toolkit for Tournament Directors at sanctioned events. It has been translated into several different languages and WFDF has received requests from other international sports federations to get access to it.

The Athletes' Commission had been up for reelection at a major WFDF tournament and without such an event its mandate had been extended to 2021 and is to be extended for yet another year.

WFDF had published the e-book "Ultimate at Schools Programme Teacher's File" in several translations.

WFDF continues to pursue the goal to participate at LA28. The number of WFDF members is expected to rise to 100 with the goal to reach 120 by 2024. 17 WFDF member National Federations are recognized by their National Olympic Committees (NOCs) and WFDF is currently supporting Members in Italy and New Zealand to reach NOC membership in their respective countries. Rauch encouraged all members to pursue NOC recognition and ask for support through WFDF's Executive Director Bernardi.

WFDF is trying to increase its visibility within the world of sport and has been successful with the key publication insidethegames.biz, and that effort will continue.

In the 2021 WFDF Census, members have reported a sharp reduction in the number of athletes. This was expected and it is also expected that this number will go up again as soon WFDF can restart its events in 2022. Plans for 2022 include six WFDF world championships with the World Ultimate Club Championships (WUCC) in Cincinnati being the largest. Another highlight is WFDF's participation at The World Games in Birmingham, AL, USA.

Rauch then mentioned the proposed bylaw revision to be voted on later during Congress. The changes are in accordance with the IOC standards of regular membership and WFDF is trying to adjust its approach with respect to financial requirements for membership. WFDF hopes this will give everyone an opportunity to participate without undue burden.

Report by the Executive Director



WFDF Executive Director Bernardi presented the network of organizations of which WFDF is a member, a partner, or has official recognition. These affiliations enable WFDF to participate in several multisport games, which raise the visibility of Flying Disc sports. Staying in touch and especially creating new connections with these organizations keeps the WFDF administration busy despite the constraints due to the pandemic.

WFDF was able to welcome 13 new members during the past 12 months and Bernardi announced that during Congress the vote for WFDF's 100th member Kyrgyzstan would be finalized. This is a milestone which will improve the standing of WFDF within the Olympic Movement.

Next year's multisport games flagship event is The World Games. Flying Disc will be attend with eight Ultimate national teams (from USA, CAN, GBR, GER, JPN, FRA, AUS, COL) in a five day competition July 12th to 16th, 2022. Disc Golf will be included in the Sports Garden at TWG as a demonstration sport. Ticket sales have already opened.

Due to the postponement of the Tokyo Olympic Games to 2021 several multisport games were also postponed by 1 or 2 years. There will be many opportunities to participate in these games, such as the World Masters Games 2022 in Kansai, Japan, where registration has opened and WFDF recommends teams to sign up. Other notable games are the Pan American Masters Games 2022 and the 2nd TAFISA European Games 2022. WFDF is currently trying very much to present the sport in China at the Asian Games 2022 in Hangzhou (CHN) and the Asian Beach Games in Sanya (CHN). Other games targeted are Asia Pacific Masters Games 2023 Jeonbuk (KOR), European Masters Games 2023, Tampere (FIN), African Games 2023, Accra (GHA), EUSA European Universities Games 2024 Games in Debrecen-Miskolc (HUN).

WADA had introduced new Anti-Doping rules in 2021 resulting in an increase of actions necessary, even though there were no WFDF events. WFDF still sees Anti-Doping education as a path to reduce testing.

On new members Bernardi expected to see applications from Africa, Eastern Europe, Central America and the Caribbean. WFDF Continental Associations were helping on membership applications, governance and development. He restated that it was important that every member contact its National Olympic Committee seeking recognition. The newest project was the creation of the Mediterranean Flying Disc Confederation (MFDC), which would enable Flying Disc to become a member of the International Committee of Mediterranean Games (CIJM).

WFDF will add one commission (Sustainability and Legacy Commission) and change the name of another commission (Athletes' Entourage Commission to Athletes' Entourage Commission) in accordance with IOC. Bernardi encouraged member federations to nominate representatives for the WFDF committees and commissions.



Review of 2021 Member Census

Rauch presented the 2021 WFDF Census data briefly. The detailed report has been sent to members before the 2021 Congress. WFDF has seen a sharp 34.5% decline in number of members in 2021. WFDF expects to see this rebound in 2022. The relative break down between men and women has remained constant in the last years at 65%/35%, and WFDF encourages growth in number of women.

The census gives an idea how members compare to each other on different metrics. Rauch thanked all for completing this annual census, which has been compiled since 2002.

Annual Risk Assessment

This is something WFDF instituted eight years ago to flag issues that may impact WFDF and provide guidance for WFDF's national federations:

- Sustaining or improving the quality and consistency in the delivery of all our events
- 2. Ensuring safety and safety for participants, coaches, officials, spectators and volunteers
- 3. WFDF's Ability to recruit/attract sufficient volunteers
- 4. Maintaining and increasing membership and participation
- 5. Sustaining and improving financial viability
- 6. Protecting or improving public image and reputation with stakeholders, regulators, potential sponsors, and media
- 7. Maintaining Spirit of the Game (SOTG) as an essential component of flying disc sports
- 8. Applying good corporate governance principles including compliance with regulatory requirements

The pandemic has put WFDF's financial viability to the test as its reliance on the quadrennial event cycle and the associated revenues had come to a stop. The mitigant was to maintain a cash reserve which helped WFDF get through the first year of the pandemic. WFDF also sharply decreased its expenses and Rauch thanked WFDF's paid staffers who faced a reduction in their compensation for 2021.

President Rauch asked to vote on the presented WFDF Annual Risk Assessment. The Annual Risk Assessment was approved unanimously.

Event Manager Report



Managing Director Events and Operations Woldt reported that all events from 2020 and 2021 had been canceled and all money not spent had been returned to players and teams.

Moving athletes cross border still is a problem but with the European Team Disc Golf Championships (ETDGC) taking place in Croatia during Congress WFDF could gain experience through this limited event with five European countries. The event was going on very well, but even at this level some athletes had problems with crossing borders.

As for the 2022 WFDF events, Woldt advised that no bulletins had been sent out for any of the events yet as WFDF was trying carefully analyze what was needed to run these events successfully during the pandemic. She expected to send out the first information within the next few weeks and asked all members interested to participate to react quickly.

WFDF plans to host six events in 2022. The World Beach Ultimate Championships will be the first in April with 10 divisions planned for. When registration opens the members will only have a short time of 2 – 3 weeks to decide and sign up teams. At this stage crossing borders is difficult but she asked all members to send in any concerns or questions to make the WFDF Event Team aware who is thinking about attending.

The World Masters Ultimate Club Championships will be in late June in Ireland. It is planned to invite all divisions and if six or more teams sign up for a division then that division will take place.

Planning for The World Games in mid July has started a while ago by IWGA. All teams involved should be receiving updates frequently.

TWG is followed directly by several events:

World Flying Disc Championships (WOC) USA World Ultimate Club Championships (WUCC) USA World Junior Ultimate Championships (WJUC) DOM World Team Disc Golf Championships (WTDGC) CRO

WFDF is listening to advice and following guidance of the governments. At this stage it is unlikely that WFDF will mandate vaccines but it might be that the COVID hygiene plans per event might include restrictions if you are not vaccinated or prefer not to tell WFDF.

For the first time WFDF is including a Junior Under 20 Mixed division at WJUC if enough interest is received. All members are asked to look at the viability of sending a third team or if perhaps this new division will open up the possibility to send a team at all.



Rauch commented that WFDF is changing the transfer of money with all going through WFDF. WFDF is trying to have the hosts push out the spending of money as far out as possible due to the uncertainties created by the pandemic. Woldt added that there is an outline about what amount gets non-refundable as the event gets closer.

WFDF Anti-Doping Program and WADA Compliance

WFDF Anti-Doping Administrator Verleger emphasized that Anti-Doping matters were important not only for WFDF matters but also for its members, as they also need to fulfill all requirements by WADA. Those members without an AD program could receive help from WFDF by approaching him or Bernardi.

Verleger announced that in 2021 WADA had confirmed officially to WFDF that it was compliant to the current WADA Code. This was a big success and he thanked all WFDF bodies involved in reaching this goal.

Verleger announced that by the end of 2021 there would be an AD survey sent to the NFs which would help WFDF to improve its AD work.

WFDF Membership Updates

Bernardi reported that in the current vote for five new members and PDGA as associate member 47 of the regular members had cast a vote. All new member applications had been approved unanimously, by which WFDF now had officially 100 national federation members. Bernardi saw this as a great sign of solidarity and thanked the members involved.

Rauch thanked everyone for participating in these votes. The process of bringing in new members involves checking their documents thoroughly and in many cases takes 2-3 years of working with the applicants. He had set out a goal for the Executive Director several years ago to reach 100 members as this number was seen as a milestone by umbrella sport organizations and he felt very grateful that Bernardi had achieved this.

In a brief celebration, Bernardi was presented with a surprise cake with 100 candles to celebrate this milestone. It was delivered to his home as arranged by the Event Team and presented over Zoom to the Congress. Bernardi thanked everyone for this surprise.

Bernardi then reported that he expected to receive many more membership applications in the next few years with the help of the Continental federations. He saw opportunities in Africa where he found many Flying Disc communities through the Internet, as well as in Pan America. The application process can be tedious as WFDF checks all documents and it can take several years. A new goal would be to have 120 members by 2024.



Rauch congratulated Bernardi for his great work in regard to increasing WFDF's membership.

Bylaws Revision

In March 2021 WFDF had sent several Bylaw revisions to its members for comment:

- Change of definition of national members vs. provisional members. After two
 years of provisional membership there is a conversion to regular status upon
 filing a report on activities and approval by Congress. This includes a change in
 dues (see below).
- Include WADA Code compliance as a requirement for WFDF membership.
- Transition for WFDF members to one member per country will be extended by two years.
- In the case that a Continental Association (CA) President is already a member of the Board in another function, the CA can send an alternate representative from their Board membership
- Title Executive Director will be changed to Secretary General
- Change the name of the Entourage Commission to "Athletes' Entourage Commission", change the name of the Youth in Sport Commission to "University, School Sport and Youth Commission", and add the "WFDF Parasport Commission." We will also establish a "Sustainability and Legacy Commission".

President Rauch asked to vote on the revised WFDF Bylaws. The revised WFDF Bylaws were approved unanimously.

Financial Report

Vote: Approval of 2020 Audited Financial Statements

Treasurer Bergeron presented a comparison of the WFDF audit summaries for 2019 and 2020. She remarked that for WFDF to use a four year cadence for its financial planning in line with the four year cycle of events and its varying income was fortuitious as it greatly helped WFDF manage its finances through the pandemic. 2020 had started quite well with the upcoming WUGC in the Netherlands and higher income as usual but in the middle of the year a lot of that income needed to be refunded. WFDF had to revise its budget planning mainly to scale back expenses.

The audit of 2020 confirms that WFDF had not spent more money than budgeted and going into 2021 WFDF was in a solid financial position.

Bergeron asked to vote on the 2020 Audited Financial Statements as presented. The financial statements were approved unanimously with one abstention.



Interim 2021 report

Bergeron gave an overview of expenditures and income. On dues income she acknowledged that all members had been impacted by the pandemic related shut downs. WFDF had reduced membership fees for 2021 and she reported that the budgeted dues related income had been already received. Income through event fees was almost zero in 2021 and since most sponsorship income was related to events there was also nothing to expect from that side. The annual grant of US\$ 32,000 by IOC was also received in 2021 but this money must be spent for development and Anti-Doping. Overall the income side in 2021YTD was in line with the budget plan.

On the expense side WFDF was saving much money which would normally be needed for checking event venues or running events such as travel and accommodation costs for WFDF officials. The majority of WFDF's expenditures is spent for staff, but WFDF decided to keep its staff as it is a huge part of keeping WFDF on track. Other expenditures are for official memberships and special projects and developments. This amounts to a current loss of US\$ 72,000 against the projected US\$ 84,000 and WFDF expects that to double towards the end of 2021.

WFDF still has money in the bank but since Bergeron expected the large event income as late as mid 2022 this reserve will be used to keep WFDF running in 2022. Usually in the first half of the year smaller income as dues are received and the larger income through events in the second half.

Vote: Approval of 2022 budget

Bergeron referred to the detailed 2022 budget in the briefing book. The expected event related income there of over US\$ 200,000 depends on all planned events to take place. If the pandemic related situation changes towards the end of 2021 WFDF will need to revise the budget drastically.

Bergeron asked to vote on the Approval of 2022 budget. The WFDF 2022 budget was approved unanimously with one abstention.

Vote: Approval of 2021 Auditor

Bergeron briefly presented the accounting firm McMillen & Company, PLLC whose principal has been the audit partner for WFDF for the past five years. She confirmed that the relationship had been effective and very helpful for WFDF.



Bergeron asked to vote and approve McMillen & Company, PLLC as the official auditor for WFDF's 2021 financial statements. The approval was given unanimously with one abstention.

Discussion topic: Discussion topic: Challenges and Opportunities for Flying Disc Sports Post-COVID-19

Rauch took the opportunity to present Dan 'Stork' Roddick who was participating in the Congress call as a guest. Roddick has been involved in Flying Disc sports since the 1960s both as an athlete, organizer, and book author. Recently he had been instrumental in working with WFDF and PDGA to get back together. Rauch asked Roddick to give a few comments on the development of Flying Disc sports since the 1960s.

Roddick greeted the attendees and noted he felt overwhelmed by the number of participants. More people were attending the Zoom meeting than there had been participants at the first Octad in 1974, an Overall tournament. He commended WFDF for its hard work which had led to this spread of Flying Disc into regions and countries which had been only dreamed about at that time.

Speaking for the PDGA he expected a new highly effective cooperation between Disc Golf and the general disc community covered by WFDF. The nature of Disc Golf had turned out to be a pandemic favorable activity and had most likely helped to keep athletes from other disciplines stay within the sport as, e.g. as many Ultimate players did. He expected them to get back to running and playing Ultimate at the end of the pandemic. He thanked for the opportunity to sit in and see what WFDF had achieved.

Rauch thanked Roddick for attending and passing on his comments. He described Roddick as the Godfather behind Flying Disc sports and that he had laid the ground for organizing bodies and also for WFDF.

Rauch then invited the attendees to give ideas and comments how they were bringing their national federations back into the sport post-COVID.

Paul Kenny (FPA) mentioned that in Freestyle the pandemic had brought up a new format online called Tiny Room Battle Challenge which had been so successful that he expected that to stay and perhaps even lead to future world championships.

Tom Crawford (USA, USAU) noted that he was looking forward to welcoming as many athletes as possible to the WFDF Ultimate events planned in the USA. The USAU, the tournament organizers and WFDF were ready to make these events the best possible experience.



Alex Matovu (AAFDF) thanked everyone for help he had received particularly in regards to Disc Golf, which many African athletes had started to play. Also, FPA had helped through Kenny to get Freestyle going in Nigeria. He expected more African countries to take up Ultimate, Disc Golf and Freestyle and eventually become WFDF members.

Simon Farrow (Australia, AFDA) reported that in Australia all borders had been closed and they were evaluating their national events for the rest of the year. The juniors' program for Primary school would be included into the school sports program. AFDA was focusing on grass roots as they could not do much for national teams. They were encouraging their states to restart within the next three months.

Desmond Mantey (Ghana, GFDA) thanked for the support his association had received. Due to the pandemic they had not been able work hard on their school projects. He was optimistic that Ghana could attend the 2023 All Africa Ultimate Championships. GFDA was likely to be recognized by the government.

Daniel Bannoura (Palestine, PFDA) reported that activities had restarted with a hat tournament a few weeks ago and going back into schools offering practice there. Summer camps were being offered in the Gaza strip and they would join Jordan in organizing a hat tournament there in November 2021.

Rauch commented that the pandemic was affecting different countries in different ways. Vaccination rates differed strongly between countries. WFDF was trying to get back on track with offering events, but needed to be careful about asking for upfront commitments. He asked the members to communicate with WFDF and the Event Team. Any feedback received would help improve WFDF's ability to run events. Even if some countries could not attend WFDF events for reasons associated with the pandemic WFDF would do its best to run events for those who would be available to participate as long as the latest wave does not make it more difficult than now. He hoped that activities could restart on a local, regional and national basis and that he could see everyone again in 2022.

Other Business and Q&A

On request of the Haiti representatives Rauch gave them time for an update on the situation there.

Marco Bigo (Haiti, HFD) expressed gratitude to be accepted by WFDF as a member. The HFD was looking forward to participating in upcoming events in and outside the country. But Haiti was going through a hard time after the devastating earthquake on August 14, 2021. Haiti wanted everyone to know and to ask for moral and material help. Haiti would continue to spread Flying Disc in the country by creating teams and offering practice sessions.



President Rauch concluded Congress by thanking everyone for their time and support towards WFDF. He added that WFDF Committees and Commission written reports were presented at the end in the Briefing Book. He encouraged to read these reports as they documented what was happening in WFDF. Anyone with questions should approach the Executive Committee or the Board members.

Rauch declared Congress closed at 17:20 CEST, thanked everyone for joining and wished all members good luck in getting back to full strength.

WFDF: COVID Impact on Disc Sports (2020-21)



Events

- All WFDF events for 2020 were postponed or canceled as of March 24, 2021. The final cancelation of postponed events was announced May 26, 2020.
- Most national championships were postponed or canceled in 2020.
- WFDF canceled or postponed all World Championship events for 2021 as of January 14, 2021. ETDGC was successfully held. Beach Ultimate World Championship scheduled for April 2022 was also canceled due to ongoing travel restrictions.
- A number of countries were able to host national championships in the second half of 2021.
- WFDF has a busy 2022 schedule: Masters Ultimate Clubs, The World Games, World Ultimate Clubs, Juniors, Team Disc Golf, Overalls.

Organizations

- Without events, most disc sports organizations faced a financial crisis.
- Revenue models are highly dependent on member dues, event sanctioning fees, and eventspecific sponsorships.
- WFDF's 2021 revenues were decreased by 90% from original budget. Many member associations faced equally drastic reductions.
- Expenses in 2020 and 2021 were cut dramatically at largest NFs. USA Ultimate announced a reduction in force, pay cuts, and furloughs of staff. UK Ultimate announced furloughs and reduction in hours. And on and on.
- The one bright spot globally has been disc golf, as it has benefited from significant interest as a healthy outdoor activity in the midst of the pandemic.

WFDF: Challenges/Issues in 2022 and Beyond



- Ongoing event postponements/cancelations have been very disruptive, reducing opportunities for our athletes to practice and compete at any levels, and sharply reducing the revenues of flying disc sport organizations
- Beyond the obvious impact on activities in 2020 and 2021, this has potential longer term impacts on: (a) participation, with previous participants finding alternative pastimes, (b) organizing bodies who are losing human and financial resources and will be less able to service their communities, (c) opportunities for growth and recognition, as the Olympics and other multi-sports games downsize and give priority to their incumbents, (d) number of new WFDF member countries.
- There is still significant uncertainty existing around the course of the COVID-19 pandemic, especially in light of the variants which have emerged. There is a good hope that, despite sport not coming back to "normal" in 2021, people will be able in 2022 to gather to play sports in groups, attend large-scale events, and travel cross-border without undue expense, quarantines, and uncertainty.
- Furthermore, we are seeing an increased influence of global and national politics on sport, and citizens' rights have gained importance in selecting hosts, staging events and practicing sport.
- Despite the challenges, there are increasing demands regarding athlete safeguarding, non-discrimination and equality, sustainability, conservation and mitigation of climate change. These take forethought and resources.







WFDF Response to Ukraine Situation

WFDF Board of Directors announced 2 March 2022 the following five measures:

- 1. The WFDF Board affirms its full solidarity with the Ukrainian Flying Disc Federation (UFDF), the Ukrainian Olympic community, and all the people of Ukraine. In particular, it will do what it can to support the members of the Flying Disc community in Ukraine.
- 2. The Russian Flying Disc Federations (RFDF) and the Belarusian Flying Disc Federation (BFDF) are suspended with immediate effect, including the full set of their membership rights, until further notice.
- 3. No athletes or officials from Russia and Belarus are eligible to participate in any WFDF sanctioned event, until further notice.
- 4. All persons from Russia and Belarus holding positions of leadership in WFDF, or who serve in WFDF Committees and Commissions in any capacity, are asked to resign from their position with immediate effect.
- 5. No WFDF sanctioned events will be awarded to Russia and Belarus until further notice (none are currently scheduled).






World Flying Disc Federation 2022 Annual Census



Overview of WFDF Census Data Report

WFDF has done a formal annual survey of members since at least 2002. Over that period, there has been a compound average growth rate in players governed by WFDF's Member Associations of 7.1%, down from the previous pace through 2020 of 10.4% because of the dampening effect on competition due to the pandemic.

7.1% from 2002 to 2022 10.3% from 2002 to 2020 12.9% from 2009 to 2020 7.0% from 2011 to 2020 -18.1% from 2020 to 2022 The impact of the coronavirus pandemic was clearly reflected in the membership numbers reported by WFDF's member federations, dropping by a third due to COVID and not recovering in 2021. We would expect this number to bounce back with the resumption of international competition in 2022. Many of our Members do not directly oversee the disc golf activities in their countries, which was the one discipline that actually saw significant growth.

Despite the growth in the number of member countries, the growth in number of players has been slowing in recent years. It is not clear whether member associations are losing registered players or whether the tie between number of players and WFDF Membership Dues is causing certain Members to underreport in recent years. More analysis is required.

We note that the number of women reported by our Members has remained fairly steady, nearly 35%, over the last decade.

The following tables provide self-reported data from most of WFDF's member associations. This includes data on: number of athletes and teams across the various disciplines, governance and a financial overview, development, communications, official recognition, media coverage, sponsorships, antidoping activities, and finally more granular data on the various disciplines.

Introduction

2022 - The comeback year!

With the two worst years in the history of global sports events behind us, WFDF, our member National Federations and the Flying Disc Community are sitting, eagerly awaiting the outcome of this summer's events. Only time will tell what impacts the pandemic and also the unrest in Eastern Europe will have (if any) on the 2022 season after the devastating cancellations necessary during the pandemic in 2020,2021 and even through early 2022 in addition to the current uncertainties the Russian war is causing.

At the time of writing this report, there are just 30 days until our first major Ultimate Tournament since our last event (PAUC 2019). WMUCC's disc-pull will mark the end to 31 long months with no WFDF Ultimate Events as we managed travel restrictions and safety uncertainties - we were forced to adjust to the lack of human interactions, limited field play and lost incomes and therefore this summer if it eventuates as planned with be a huge achievement and sigh of relief for everyone.

Players, especially at the elite international level, seem to be focused and keen to get back out on the field, wondering what the break has done to both their playing level and as to their competitors - will there be unexpected surprises of greatness?

Getting back on track this year has been essential to the growth and development of our sport and to continue to build on the momentum we had shown through 2018/2019. WFDF headed into 2021 quarter 4 with our sights set on a full program and began working on at least 6 events, but we again found ourselves having to deal with setbacks and lockdowns as major 2nd and 3rd pandemic waves surged as winter approached.

While the past year has been challenging and complex for WFDF's events team, dealing with reduced planning windows, cautious approaches to spending, extensive communications with countries it seems to look like 2022's comeback and return to normal is a possibility. WFDF has been working with LOC's to manage restrictions and mitigate risks to attempt to get back on track and to bring WFDF's event calendar back to life. Following is a quick look at 2022's schedule;

- WBUC was due to take place in April in LA and was to be WFDF's showcase to the IOC for our bid inclusion in 2028, however due to the pandemic teams found themselves nervous and unable to fully commit to registration and payment deadlines while also dealing with border restrictions and severely regulated ability to train and form teams. As a result, WFDF needed to cancel the event.
- Ireland will be hosts to WMUCC with a near 3300 participants taking part in what is forecasted to be the biggest and best masters event for WFDF ever!
- WUCC, back in the US for its second time around, is again at full capacity showing a balanced



- gender split with half players in attendance being female.
- WFDF has teamed up with EUF to combine WJUC U20 and EYUC U17 events, maximising the
 efficiency of sharing logistics with one venue and one host.
- Disc Golf is coming of the back of impressive and major growth, shining as the disc sport that
 was able to most capitalise on the effects of the pandemic a sport that is predominantly
 played with few people who can keep distance on an outdoor course saw a lot of new flying
 disc enthusiasts take up the sport. In line with this growth, WTDGC 2022 has the biggest
 gathering of international players for any DG event ever 25 countries are due to compete in
 Croatia this summer.
- Last but not least, the IWGA World Games with eight countries competing in the Flying Disc
 Ultimate discipline will also form a major part of the Flying Disc Calendar for 2022 for WFDF and it's highest ranked members

In a sign of positive hope that things are returning to normal. WFDF can report a promising outlook on the 2023 and 2024 events seasons where our recent call to bid looking for hosts and venues produced a strong and encouraging list of bid candidates that are wanting to host all of WFDF's major events. WFDF will continue to focus on holding this year's events successfully, safely and above all professionally while keeping a keen eye on the extended calendar of events.

We are so very much looking forward to seeing players, coaches, organisers, volunteers and officials all back at our events this season .

Covid-19 Working Group

Right from the beginning of the pandemic, WFDF put in place a regular monitoring system to anticipate the potential impacts of the Pandemic on our events. The WFDF Covid-19 Working Group discussed the complex situations that formed when hosting events and bringing as many as 45 different counties together while weighing up both the pros and cons of cancellations and moving forward as well as the health and safety risks on the field of play.

With conference calls, questionnaires and frequent in-between emails the group was able to share extensive information from the perspective of teams and countries and hosts while developing and discussing numerous scenarios prior to decisions being made.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the working group for your open and professional sharing of information and to thank the teams and country coordinators for updates and in-depth, live time actual positions of your teams so that the best decisions could be made with a view from all aspects.

In particular, an enormous thank you to Dr Jamie Nuwer and Dr Matthias Zaccarin who although overly busy and in the middle of the crisis themselves working the front line, found the time to provide WFDF with medical and sound advice that could be then used to make decisions in the best interest of everyone.

2021 an almost event-less flying disc season.

For the 2nd year in a row, WFDF found itself in January 2021 looking through the events calendar and striking out and cancelling the entire WFDF 2021 Events season. After careful consideration it was deemed that a slower than expected roll out of vaccine programs across our member NF's and the

ongoing global travel restrictions made hosting events non-viable and the financial risks to prepare, plan and produce events too high.

Late in the season the WFDF Disc Golf Committee and the Executive Committee decided to make the most of the inter-continental border corridors that were open for travel by hosting a continental Disc Golf Championship. At short notice the European Disc Golf Championship was successfully planned and hosted in Croatia with 5 European teams battling it out for not only the gold medal, but also the super-sweet feeling of returning to international play. The field of countries taking part remained restricted by the impacts of Covid but the participating countries all provided positive feedback. This event was hosted by the same LOC and at the same venue as the planned 4th WTDGC 2022 event, and has proven to be a great dress rehearsal for this year's event.

The ETDGC was hosted over 4 days from Wed 18th to Sat 21st of August on a temporary 18 hole course located on the Drava river forest and embankment. With a severe lack of planning time and major uncertainties around the viability of the event, sponsors were not engaged, however the event was proudly supported by the Croatian Flying Disc Federation, the City of Varaždin and the Varaždin City Tourist Board. All stakeholders were extremely satisfied with the event and have all indicated their intentions to be part of WTDGC 2022.

Fee collection process

WFDF has piloted a new fee collection process which for the first time in 2022, it sees WFDF collect all fees for all events and then distribute back to the LOC in monthly instalments based on cash flow projections and accurate payment requirements. In an attempt to safeguard the financial input from teams and NF's and given the challenges faced during cancellation in 2022, it was determined that the new process was the most beneficial to teams.

WFDF collected close to 2.3 million dollars in event revenues in 2021/2022 and continues to feed back to the events. With the cancellation of WBUC, full returns of all players fees and a partial repayment of the team fees were able to be made back to teams within just weeks of making the decision to cancel. It also enabled WFDF to transfer credits to other event fees at the direction of the NF.

WFDF believes that this pilot program has been successful and will continue to use such a system for all events going forward. During the later months of 2022, WFDF will review and evaluate the opportunities of automation for invoicing and fee collection.

Virtual Sports

During a pandemic, what could be better than hosting an event in person? Hosting and organising a sporting event with thousands of participants from around the globe, all of whom take part from the comfort of their own lounge rooms!

WFDF's Inaugural 2022 Virtual Sport World Team Disc Golf Championship was presented in partnership with Latitude 64 and Spinoff games took place through January and February this year.

Individuals from 40 countries that were the most frequent users of Disc Golf Valley were invited to participate in the inaugural event. The restricted capacity gave WFDF and the App Developers the opportunity to gain valuable experience for our first run through.



WFDF wanted to take advantage of the huge rise in popularity of Virtual Sport and Disc Golf by establishing an event that eguages with the community, taking advantage of no travel or lockdown restrictions to overcome.

39 countries took part in the country qualifications which were hosted by gender to find the best female (1) and best male (1) who then formed a virtual mixed gender team (2) representing the country in the finals. Countries were given a specific 7 day window for practice and for players to register their best stroke play round for a final score.

Disc Golf Valley is an online game app by Spinoff Games and is supported on both iOS and Android OS. Players used simple controls to play disc golf on mobile devices. This enabled players to play on some of the most beautiful and challenging disc golf courses in the world and the event was able to capture the thrill and excitement from their own homes.

WFDF will come back to a slightly modified version of the event in 2023 and anticipate this event to become part of the regular yearly events calendar.

Beach Ultimate

After a disappointing decision to cancel WBUC 2022, WFDF has continued to look to find any suitable ability to host a World Championships for Beach Ultimate in the near future. The event is typically a four yearly event with the last one held in Royan in 2017. 2021 was initially pushed back due to the pandemic, however the event registration and team interest continued to dwindle to the point of non-viability and waiting until the next scheduled event in 2025 leaves a huge void in the Beach Ultimate Calendar for National teams.

As result and after discussions with the LA organising committee, WFDF's Beach Ultimate Committee in agreement with the WFDF Executive Committee have agreed to make preparations for a Q4 2023 event. Information will be forthcoming in the June/July months and we kindly ask all member NF's to work with your teams to enable registration to run smoothly.

The Beach Ultimate Committee also recently made a significant change to the scheduled cycle of Continental Beach Ultimate Championships deciding to move the events to even years, enabling them to be offset from grass continental events in a hope to spread the attendance further. The next continental beach events will take place in 2024.

Wheelchair Ultimate

WFDF is planning to host its first Wheelchair Ultimate Championships in the USA in 2023. While bid details are being worked out and information will be shared in the official bulletin and invitation to participate which is due out in July, member NF's are kindly asked to start working on finding interest and ability to field teams for such championships.

WFDF Wheelchair Ultimate Working Group will continue to work through in establishing a clear set of rules and guidelines for the sport.



Grass Ultimate

WFDF Events team continues to be strongly supported by the Chair of the Ultimate Committee when making decisions and planning for the future events.

Generating 2022's events successfully and with as many teams as possible has been our main priority. This allows hosts, participants, NF's and WFDF to all make the most out of the possible return to the field. Both WUCC and WMUCC are at capacity which is fantastic to see, however there are still some notable missing countries that WFDF will work together with in understanding and overcoming any challenges these countries are facing to ensure they are back by 2023/2024.

The return to existing and experienced hosts for both WJUC and WUCC has also reinforced the efficiency of returning to the same venue year after year. As a result, WFDF will be encouraging LOC's with proven skills and past successes in hosting events, to consider bidding for major (larger) events after first hosting smaller practice events first.

Outlook at events for 2023 and beyond

It is paramount for the WFDF event cycles and calendar to return to normal as soon as possible. For any events that were cancelled and not taking place during the pandemic, no provisions or allowances will be made to accommodate teams/players who missed out.

All 2023 and 2024 events have been called to bid with the bid evaluation process taking place now with an announcement for all events in Q2/Q3 2022. WFDF recognises the increasing demand on bids for major events and is looking at ways to ensure smaller venues are still viable options for hosting events. This might create a need for change to event allocations and structures, with some very large events being drilled down by divisions (similar to the split out of masters from WUC/WUCC)

Event websites, social media and event stats

A reminder that WFDF has common website domain names for all events now, i.e. www.wucc.sport, www.wucc.sport, and all our LOC's are provided with a common hosting service for both website and event specific e-mail addresses such as info@wucc.sport. This avoids domain purchases and provides a consistent URL structure across all events, with WFDF retaining 'ownership' of the domain and providing simpler archiving and transfer to future LOC's.

Conclusion

Unfortunately it will take some considerable time to catch back up to the momentum and participation levels at WFDF Events that we had in 2018/2019 and it will also take some time for the uncertainties to ease. Despite the fact that the virus remains, there is a huge amount of hope that the positive signs of returning to normality will oneday help all forget the 2+ years of travel restrictions and health concerns.

The 2022 LOC's have shown great cooperation and patience and have committed to the necessary drive and engagement that is required to make our events return while mitigating the risks as best they can.

We will continue to engage our members through constructive dialogue at the top level, while seeking the best way to meet tight deadlines. Please do not hesitate to reach out to Patrick and I to provide updates on the challenges your NF/team is facing, and to ask questions.

Overview

The work of the Disc Golf Committee has grown and expanded considerably since it was re-formulated in 2016. Disc Golf now takes up a much larger space in the WFDF world and the events and responsibilities that we have taken on continue to challenge us and our ability to deliver all our work at a very high level. Since 2016 Disc Golf within WFDF has grown from a static state to a significant contributor to Flying Disc events within WFDF and its member states.

During 2021-22 the Disc Golf Committee has been active in the following areas, all part of the five year plan outlined in the Congress report in 2020:

- Development of World, Continental and Regional Team Disc Golf Events with an emphasis on European Team Disc Golf Championships delivered in August in Croatia
- Planning for WFDF 2022 World Team Disc Golf Championships in Croatia.
- Involvement of Disc Golf as a Demonstration Sport at TWG in Birmingham Al, USA in July 2022
- Creation and delivery of 1st WFDF Virtual Sport Disc Golf Championship in collaboration with Disc Golf Valley and Latitude 64/SpinOff Games.
- Planned participation in the first IOC Olympic Virtual Sports (OVS) event in 2023
- WFDF and Disc Golf Membership Relationship between WFDF members, IOC, NOC's and GAISF and PDGA membership of WFDF.
- Development of SOTG criteria to be applied to Team Disc Golf Championships.
- New criteria for World rankings reviewed

Though we had interest from Costa Rica, Malaysia, Australia and South Africa to host other continental or regional events these did not happen - but we are hopeful that they may do so in 2023 when this cycle of events comes round again.

WFDF Disc Golf Virtual Games

The first WFDF Virtual Sport Disc Golf Championships were held in January and February 2022 in partnership with Disc Golf Valley, Latitude 64 and SpinOff Games. The event was won by Great Britain.

The event was a mixed doubles pairing - playing from their own homes via the DGV platform. The top 40 countries using DGV were invited to enter players in Round 1, plus an 'other' team for those countries not in that initial list. The top male and female gamers were then selected to pay the finals.

39 countries took part including "other" 3262 participants 9.81% of the participants were female

- -30 par was the top ranked female (Great Britain)
- -39 par was the top ranked male (Spain)

On the back of the success of this event WFDF are bidding to be included in the first Olympic Virtual Sport event in Singapore in March 2023. We will host a further VSDGC with DGV to determine participants later in 2022.

The World Games 2022 - Birmingham Al. USA

Disc Golf will be included as a demonstration sport at TWG in July 2022. We will be supported by PDGA who will deliver the infrastructure and staff to promote and demonstrate Disc Golf in the Plaza and Garden Areas as well as between matches at the Ultimate fields.

In January 2022 the Disc Golf Committee nominated Paige Pierce as our choice for Athlete of the Year. After three weeks of voting Paige came fourth - a massive achievement given the sports above her were already Olympic Sports (Hockey, Sport Climbing) or massively popular in China - Wushu.

We are hopeful that TWG will recognise the popular appeal of Disc Golf - both in Birmingham and through Athlete of the Year - and accept our application to become a participant sort at TWG in 2025 in China.

Spirit of the Game for Disc Golf

The DG Committee, led by Bruno Gravato and the SOTG Committee, has been developing a system of introducing SOTG to Team Disc Golf. This mirrors many of the aspects of SOTG within Ultimate. It has been trialled in Portugal and will be used in Italy and other volunteer countries over the coming months with the purpose of introducing SOTG to WTDGC 2022.

This may or may not be a realistic possibility due to staffing and financial considerations but this project will be developed and is a long term aim of DG Comm to embed SOTG in all WFDF Team Disc Golf events in the future.

Policies and Practice

The DG Committee continue to contribute to the developing policies and practices of WFDF. This year there has been a focus on the issue of trans gender athletes and the response from the wider community. We are actively supporting the current survey by University of Swansea, UK for and on trans gender athletes and any issues raised by elite athletes across sports organisations recognised by IOC.

WFDF Disc Golf Committee and associated disc golf organisations

PDGA were approved as an Associate member of WFDF in the past year. This has strengthened our relationship and joint projects include our presence at TWG, policies and practice on trans gender issues, the emerging need to identify responses to anti-doping policies within Disc Golf and cooperation on developing WFDF members Disc Golf profiles.

Beach Ultimate Report

The Beach Ultimate Committee was quite focused on the 2021 WBUC which was subsequently rescheduled to 2022 before being cancelled early this year. Under the leadership of the Beach Ultimate Committee Member Will Christoperson, a Beach Ultimate Rules Committee was formed and, after a great deal of assistance from WFDF Ultimate Rules Chair Rueben Berg, new versions of the Beach Ultimate Rules and Rules Appendix were drafted, approved by the Beach Ultimate Committee, and accepted by the Board of Directors.

From that point on, the Beach Ultimate Committee was split into two groups to 1) create formats for the divisions of the WBUC; and 2) seed the respective divisions. Unfortunately, that work has not yet been able to commence due to the cancellation of 2022 WBUC.

Now WFDF leadership has decided that it is important to try to stage a WBUC in 2023 so as to not have an eight year gap between the most recent WBUC in 2017 and the next regularly scheduled event in 2025.

The Beach Ultimate Committee is excited for this and looks forward to the event in 2023.

Meetings of this committee have occurred in Feb, March, and May 2022.

During the past year, freestyle disc events have grown in number slightly in spite of the ongoing worldwide covid-19 pandemic.

YOUTH FREESTYLE:

Three different teams were represented in the online **United Through Sports 2021** for the second year with the assistance of Patrick Fourcampe (WFDF). In the Talent Show division, Sweden (Coach Reto Zimmerman) and Italy (Coach Edo Turri) assisted the freestyle pairs with presenting their videos that were uploaded into the UTS website for scoring. Freestyle athletes competed in the U10 and U18 divisions. Coach Yuval Reikoran (ISR) also provided video footage of his younger brother as solo talent.

Freestylers earned Gold and Silver medals for their divisions: which was shared on FB to the freestyle community

- U14 GOLD Joya Richner & Tim Rohrer

WFDF MEETINGS:

Committee chair Daniels was able to attend two WFDF board meetings and report back to the committee about how many members who are actively involved in inserting freestyle events or demonstrations within other WFDF initiatives.

PAST OR FUTURE WFDF EVENTS THAT WILL INCLUDE FREESTYLE:

- April 2022, Long Beach CA (USA). World Beach Ultimate: Freestylers were going to
 be part of a video education and promotion project within the beach ultimate event
 originally scheduled for earlier this year. Unfortunately, due to the ongoing
 pandemic, and lack of team registrations, this event was canceled. This was going to
 be a chance for freestyle demonstrations to occur during the beach ultimate
 tournament, as well as provide video footage of freestyle talent that WFDF could use
 to promote freestyle in the future.
- Wroclaw, Poland, WJUC (World Juniors Ultimate Championships)

The freestyle community has numerous young Polish players who are posting videos online about some of their jams. The upcoming ultimate event during **6-13 August** provides an opportunity for several of these freestylers (two of whom competed in the World Urban Games 2019) to demonstrate freestyle to youth athletes converging for this event. WFDF freestyle committee members have been in touch with WFDF in order to facilitate some demonstrations. More

Perugia Italy, TAFISA
 Volker Bernardi (WFDF) and Edo Turri
 (Freestyle Committee member and new Vice
 President of FPA; IT) have been in contact
 about bringing in freestyle within the TAFISA
 Perugia event in a few months. The goal is to
 provide another multisport venue in which



the joy of freestyle can be shared with other sport athletes. The freestyle committee will be assisting with connecting with TAFISA organizers (through Bernardi) to create an opportunity for freestyle.

Medellin Columbia

Juan Piercing (WFDF Freestyle Committee member) has been hosting through INDER several freestyle workshops in Medellin CO. Participants have been using both traditional freestyle discs (Discraft) and "trainer/transition" discs (X-Disc) to include as many children to the sport of freestyle.

Medellin is hoping to send and sponsor some of these young athletes to the World Freestyle Championships (rescheduled from Israel to Milan, IT) for the Sept event. The Medellin government is hoping to see the Freestyle World Championships posted on the WFDF website in order to provide some credibility to the event and emails between one of the Medellin jammers and Daniels have been exchanged making this request. As of this writing, the WFDF website has not been updated to include the FPA World Championships. Daniels will continue to monitor and encourage the Medellin freestylers to also access the FPA website.

Germany

One of the members of the Freestyle Players Association (FPA) board of directors (T Nöetze) has been in contact with ultimate event organizers (TOL) to include freestyle

demonstrations. Again, the goal of this would be to expose freestyle and the joy of "jamming," to numerous young ultimate players.

San Diego CA, USA

The WFDF World Overall event will be going on 1-6 August with Freestyle as the WFDF World Freestyle title (as has been over the



past several years). This tournament often draws international competitors for 6 days of flying disc sports from Sweden, Canada, USA, and Taiwan. The WFDF Overall has been rescheduled from 2 years ago from 2020 when the pandemic prevented it from being held. Freestyle Chair (Daniels) has been in touch with the event TD to assure that freestyle will be held consistent with world-championship expectations in terms of venue, judging, and space allocation.

SPIRIT OF THE GAME / SPIRIT OF THE JAM DOCUMENT:

This particular document has yet to be fully finalized. Many committee members are distracted by other activities going on in their regions, which has stalled our ability to complete and meet to take this to the next level. Nonetheless, it is a commitment by the freestyle committee to produce a spirit of the jam document, consistent with Spirit of the game values from ultimate.

Ongoing Work

Overall Events

We have the 2022 World Overall Flying Disc Championships in San Diego from August 1-6, 2022. We're expecting around 100 competitors across all 7 disciplines, with individual event specialists mainly focused on disc golf and freestyle.

WFDF Disciplines Video Project

We have completed videos for Ultimate and DDC. Next up are Freestyle and Beach Ultimate. The goal is to use these videos to educate, promote, and spread awareness about WFDF and what is possible with the sport of flying disc (frisbee)

Overall Demos (WUCC & WMUCC)

I will be attending the WMUCC as a player and have submitted a proposal to attend the WUCC as a WFDF representative. My goal at both events (although in more depth at WUCC since I'm not competing) is to connect with organizers and players to educate, promote, and demonstrate what's possible with frisbee through the other disciplines governed by WFDF. Mainly I'll be focusing on Disc Golf, Self Caught Flight, Distance, Accuracy, and Freestyle – pending timing and available space at both events.

Future of the Overall

During the 2022 WOC, we are planning to have a meeting with the Overall Committee along with players who have been a part of the Overall scene for a long time (some more than 40 years). Our goal is to discuss the future of the Overall. A few ideas that will be discussed are:

- 1. Creating a template for single and two-day Overall events featuring fewer players/fewer events to make running an Overall much easier
- Creating a national Overall series so we can start growing the Overall in specific countries. There is already a national Overall event/scene in Sweden so we will be discussing making some inroads in Canada, USA, and Chinese Taipei.
- 3. Continuing to spread awareness about what's possible with frisbee including promoting the idea of Frisbee Clubs and Frisbee Meets to appeal to schools with the hopes that they can kickstart their own events.

WFDF Bylaws Revision Proposed Change 2022

Purpose of Revision: The Bylaws currently require that the business materials for Congress be circulated no later than two months prior to Congress and Member proposals by 75 days prior. We are proposing to change this to one month distribution and 60 days prior, respectively.

While we realize that many members are concerned about having enough time to review and discuss Congress materials, this also means that certain proposals that are developing may not be ready in time for the cutoff. Also, in this age of instantaneous electronic communications, an extended period to ensure that communications are distributed and received is no longer necessary. Finally, the Bylaws permit electronic votes of the Congress with only one month's notice and so this revision brings the two mechanisms into conformance.

Article III, Section 5.1. of the WFDF Bylaws approved 21 August 2021 states (relevant section in yellow):

Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting of the Members shall be held each calendar year at a place and time to be fixed by the Board of Directors. The purposes of the annual meeting shall be to: (a) review and approve the previous year's financial statements and auditors' reports, (b) approve WFDF's annual budget and elect an Auditor, (c) authorize the basic strategic direction and policies of WFDF, (d) serve as a forum for discussion of general disc sports issues, and (e) to take such other action as may properly come before the Congress. The Secretary shall cause to be given to each member notice of the time and place of the annual meeting not less than three (3) calendar months prior to the date of such scheduled meeting. Members must submit all motions for consideration at the annual meeting to the Board of Directors not less than 75 days prior to the date of such scheduled meeting, and the Board shall forward to all members a meeting agenda, along with copies of all motions, reports and other relevant material for consideration at the Congress, not less than two (2) calendar months prior to the date of such scheduled meeting.

We propose that the last two sentence of the paragraph be revised as follows (with changes in yellow):

Members must submit all motions for consideration at the annual meeting to the Board of Directors not less than 60 days prior to the date of such scheduled meeting, and the Board shall forward to all members a meeting agenda, along with copies of all motions, reports and other relevant material for consideration at the Congress, not less than one (1) calendar month prior to the date of such scheduled meeting.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors World Flying Disc Federation Colorado Springs, Colorado

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of World Flying Disc Federation (a not-for-profit organization), which comprise the statement of financial position as of December 31, 2021, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of World Flying Disc Federation as of December 31, 2021, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis of Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of World Flying Disc Federation and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the

aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about World Flying Disc Federation's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of including omissions, are control. Misstatements, internal considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about World Flying Disc Federation's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

Emphasis of Matter

As described in Note F, in March 2020, the World Health Organization declared a pandemic related to a fast-spreading novel strain of coronavirus. The outbreak caused significant global disruption in commercial and noncommercial activities. The disruption may have a significant impact on future financial performance; however, the ultimate impact of this global concern cannot be determined. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Report on Summarized Comparative Information

We have previously audited the Federation's 2020 financial statements, and our report dated June 19, 2021, expressed an unmodified opinion on those audited financial statements. In our opinion, the summarized comparative information presented herein as of and for the year ended December 31, 2020, is consistent, in all material respects, with the audited financial statements from which it has been derived.

A. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization

The World Flying Disc Federation (the Federation) serves as the international governing body of all flying disc sports, with responsibility for sanctioning world championship and other international flying disc events, establishing uniform rules, and setting standards for and recording of world records; it acts to promote and protect the "spirit of the game" of flying disc sports play; to encourage flying disc sports play throughout the world and foster the establishment of new national flying disc sports Federations, advising them on all flying disc sports activities and general management; to promote and raise public awareness of and lobby for official recognition of flying disc play as sport; and to provide an international forum for discussion of all aspects of flying disc sports play. The Federation is made up of the National Federations (Members) that govern their respective disc sports. As of December 31, 2021, the Federation had 105 member Federations representing 102 countries. These members guide the administration of the Federation through Board of Directors and an Executive Director. The Federation is a member of the General Federation of International Sports Federations and the International World Games Federation and is a signatory to the World Anti-Doping Federation's (WADA) Code. It is incorporated in the State of Colorado, USA. The Federation received permanent recognition by the International Olympic Committee in 2015.

Method of Accounting

The financial statements of the Federation have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

New Accounting Pronouncements - Not Yet Adopted

In September 2020, the FASB issued ASU 2020-07, Presentation and Disclosures by Not-for-Profit Entities for Contributed Nonfinancial Assets (Topic 958). This ASU allows for the presentation and disclosure of contributions of nonfinancial assets to be more transparent in not-for-profit entities' financial statements. The new guidance will require not-for-profit entities to add a separate line item to the statement

of activities, and to include various disaggregated disclosures by category, for contributions of nonfinancial assets. ASU 2020-07 is to be applied retrospectively and would be effective for annual reporting periods beginning after June 15, 2021. Early adoption is permitted. The Federation is evaluating the impact the adoption of this standard will have on its financial statements.

Basis of Presentation

The financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Net assets, revenues, gains, and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor or grantor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

- Net assets without donor restrictions: net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed restrictions and may be expended for any purpose in performing the primary objectives of the Federation.
- Net assets with donor restrictions: net assets subject to stipulations imposed by donors, and grantors. Some donor restrictions are temporary in nature, such as those that will be met by the passage of time or other events specified by the donor. Other donor restrictions are perpetual in nature, whereby the donor has stipulated the funds be maintained in perpetuity. Donor-imposed restrictions are released when a restriction expires, that is, when the stipulated time has elapsed, when the stipulated purpose for which the resource was restricted has been fulfilled, or both.

<u>Use of Estimates in Preparation of Financial Statements</u>

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent liabilities, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of the Federation's checking and money market accounts.

Supplemental Cash Flow Information

Cash flows from operating activities do not contain any amounts paid for interest or income taxes.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at the amount management expects to collect from balances outstanding at year-end. Based on management's assessment of the credit history with customers having outstanding balances and current relationships with them, it has concluded that realized losses on balances outstanding at year-end will be immaterial. Therefore, no allowance for doubtful accounts is considered necessary.

Revenue Recognition

The Federation has analyzed the provisions of the FASB's Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 606, Revenue from Contracts with Customers. The Federation's revenue recognition policies are as follows:

- Events Events income contains a specific delivery element, and revenue is recognized at a single point in time when ownership, risks, and rewards transfer. Revenue is recognized when events are successfully conducted.
- Sponsorship revenue Sponsorship revenue is recognized in an amount that reflects the consideration that the Federation is entitled to in exchange for substantially fulfilling performance obligations specific to each contract. Sponsorships are recognized as revenue in the period in which the Federation satisfies its performance obligation to its sponsors. The Federation's performance obligations for sponsorship revenue is to provide promotion and advertising opportunities as arranged under each contract. The Federation has determined that performance obligations of existing multi-year contracts do not materially differ from year-

to-year; but it continues to evaluate each new contract for proper recognition under ASC 606.

- Membership registration
 Membership registration revenue is recognized in an amount that reflects the consideration that the Federation is entitled to in exchange for providing membership services. Registrations are recognized as revenue in the period in which the Federation satisfies its performance obligation to its members. A performance obligation is a promise in a contract to transfer a distinct good or service to a customer, as defined by ASC 606. Federation's performance obligation for membership registration revenue is to provide access competitions, membership and services. benefits accessible only to members. Annual memberships are recognized during the year of membership services.
- Grant revenue The Federation receives grants from the International Olympic Committee (IOC) to support its programs and other initiatives. The Federation assesses grants to determine if an exchange transaction exists. If so, revenue is recognized upon substantially satisfying the performance obligations under such exchange transactions.

Contributions

Contributions received are recorded as restricted support, depending on the existence and nature of any restrictions. Support that is not restricted by the donor is reported as an increase in net assets without restrictions. All other donor restricted support is reported as an increase in net assets with restrictions, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose accomplished), net assets restriction is with donor restrictions are reclassified to net assets without donor restrictions and reported in the Statement of Activities as ${\tt from}$ restrictions. assets released Restricted contributions for which restrictions are met in the same reporting period are recorded as changes to net assets without donor restrictions.

Contributed Services

The Federation records various types of in-kind contributions. Contributed services are recognized if the services received create or enhance non-financial assets or require specialized skills, are provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation. Contributions of tangible assets are recognized at fair value when received. The amounts reflected in the accompanying financial statements as in-kind contributions are offset by like amounts included in expenses.

In addition, several volunteers have donated significant amounts of their time to the Federation's program and support services. These in-kind contributions are not reflected in the financial statements since these services do not meet the criteria for recognition.

Income Tax

The Federation is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been reflected in the Federation's financial statements. The Federation's Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, is subject to examination by various taxing authorities, generally for three years after the date it was filed. Management of the Federation believes that it does not have any uncertain tax positions that are material to the financial statements.

Prior-Year Comparisons

The financial statements include certain prior year summarized comparative information in total but not by natural classification of expenses and not by net asset class. Such information does not include sufficient detail to constitute a presentation in conformity with GAAP. Accordingly, such information should be read in conjunction with the Federation's financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2020, from which the summarized information was derived.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities and the statement of functional expenses.

Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited based on internal records and estimates made by the Federation's management. Personnel costs are allocated based on an estimate of time and effort between program and supporting services.

Date of Management's Review

In preparing the financial statements, the Federation has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through April 27, 2022, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

B. AVAILABLE RESOURCES AND LIQUIDITY

The Federation regularly monitors liquidity required to meet its operating needs and other contractual commitments while striving to maximize the investment of its available funds. The Federation has two sources of liquidity at its disposal, a checking account with a balance to cover operating expenses and also a business market savings account for funds in excess of daily cash requirements. However, of these funds, a significant amount represents collections held for tournament organizing committees in preparation for events. The amounts held for tournament organizing committees are reported as Funds Held for Others in the statement of financial position.

The Federation manages resources through extensive budget forecasting over a five-year period to anticipate its ongoing activities of international events, grants, teaching clinics, and operations. The Federation regularly monitors actual to budgeted revenues and expenses to anticipate sufficient revenue to cover expenditures.

C. CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The Federation maintains its cash balances in one financial institution. The balances at the financial institution are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000. In the unlikely event of a bank failure, the Federation could suffer loss to the extent that cash balances exceed the insured amounts. Management does not believe any deposits are at risk from this concentration.

D. NET ASSETS WITH DONOR RESTRICTIONS

Net assets with donor restrictions at December 31, 2021 and 2020, consist of assets restricted for the following program:

E. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

During both the years ended December 31, 2021 and 2020, the IOC provided \$32,000 in grants to the Federation. The Federation receives economic benefits in the form of grants from the IOC in order to enhance its programs.

F. COVID-19 PANDEMIC

In March 2020, the World Health Organization declared a pandemic related to the fast-spreading novel strain of coronavirus. As a result of the global attention and concern arising from this disease (COVID-19), many governments and event organizers have taken appropriate measures to limit the spread of the disease such as postponing events.

Impacts to the Federation include disruptions and restrictions on the Federation's ability to perform services and conduct events, which could continue to inhibit its ability to secure additional sponsorships and other funding, although several sponsorships were renegotiated and extended in 2020/2021. Furthermore, the financial impacts of COVID-19 on the Federation's sponsors and grantors are unknown.

2022 WFDF Annual Congress: Broadcasting and Marketing Report

After almost three years of dormancy, WFDF has been very active with production planning and distribution dealmaking for our 2022 World Championship events. First up, in Limerick, Ireland, at the World Masters Ultimate Club Championships, we plan to have free online carriage of the main field for all seven days of the tournament, along with second-field coverage of the final four days. Our longtime partners at Ulti.tv will handle production, with, as always, a gender-equal expert commentating team, primarily from Europe. Games will be shown live on https://ulti.tv and the WFDF YouTube Channel (https://wmucc.sport. Please see the tournament website for scheduling and more information: https://wmucc.sport.

Due to a Covid postponement, the World Games return for the first time in five years, to Birmingham, Alabama. Flying disc competition among the top eight mixed-gender teams in the world is from Tuesday July 12 through Saturday July 16. The round-robin competition will be exclusively filmed by WFDF with our partner Ultiworld.com and top international commentators led by Tom Styles and Becky Thompson calling the games from Madrid, Spain plus pre-, post-, halftime, and highlights from Alabama, with Evan Lepler, Megan Tormey, and Charlie Eisenhood anchoring. In a landmark arrangement, WFDF has been granted permission to embed the video player of The Olympic Channel into our website, https://wfdf.sport. The only destination besides the WFDF website to watch the competition online—live or video-on-demand—is on The Olympic Channel's main page, https://olympics.com/en/olympic-channel. Very few other international federations have ever been allowed this level of event partnership, and WFDF is very proud of this achievement, which will bring live and delayed ultimate frisbee all over the world under the Olympic banner. In addition, we are negotiating a separate, Mandarin-language distribution arrangement inside Mainland China.

Less than a week later our production team, led by yours truly and Ultiworld, travels north to Cincinnati, Ohio for the 2022 WFDF World Ultimate Club Championships among 128 teams, where we plan to cover two showcase fields with five cameras each, a shared drone, and JumboTron video monitors. Importantly, Ultiworld and WFDF are entering into a new relationship that shifts the cost of viewership from players to audiences. This tournament represents our initial step in that process. Games will only be accessible at https://ultiworld.com for a subscription fee. This is in line with the other sports (amateur and professional) and media industries migrating their content behind paywalls and subscription services. At the time of preparing this report to Congress, final pricing details have not been finalized. However, we are sensitive to our global audiences and will strive to strike fair and equitable levels of payment for viewers.

In addition, from Cincinnati, our friends from Ulti.tv will produce coverage, primarily of European matches, for distribution on their Patreon subscription service, also a paywalled experience. Our ultimate goal with this approach is to eventually remove the costs of broadcasting and distribution from the players' fees and instead have viewers pay to watch WFDF World Championships. We also plan to have Mandarin-language distribution throughout Mainland China for WUCC.

Opening remarks by the President, Alex Matovu

Disc activities are slowly coming back to life nearly all over Africa. Almost all African countries have removed COVID test requirements on arrival provided participants have been vaccinated and there are

fewer restrictions on mass gatherings. This has helped quite a good number of disc communities to start gathering again. There has been quite a good number of tournaments and pick games which have happened in the last 6 months. However, the disruption of COVID has greatly affected the number of turn up of players in many communities, which sets back developmental for National Federations in Africa. It is not all grim and sadness in the Africa disc world though; we are very excited to report that ever since Ghana and Nigeria became part of WFDF members, they brought out a huge light in West Africa which is very exciting and great news for not just AAFDF/WFDF but the entire disc community. Over the next 12 months, we're looking forward to building on this success to rebuild and develop disc sports ahead of the All Africa Championships in 2023.

General Secretary Remarks Travis Myburgh

South Africa has managed to restart frisbee activities formally, albeit with a bit of a hangover from the COVID19 outbreak. Open and Women's Nationals (OWN) took place in November 2021 and was the first National event since 2019. There were a reduced number of teams compared to the 2019 event, however this was to be expected. Mixed Nationals was held in May 2022 with similar results. Most established clubs were able to recover from the 2-year hiatus, but some struggling and up-and-coming clubs could not. There is a silver lining though as newer players are joining and playing around the country, so there is definite growth there. The challenge South Africa faces now is to upskill these clubs as the skill handover in isolated regions was badly affected by COVID.

On the international stage, SA is sending one Open team to WUCC in Cincinnati and two Mixed teams to WMUCC. The Mixed WUCC team unfortunately had to pull out over the uncertainty surrounding getting a US visa, as appointments had long wait times. However, we are happy that some teas will compete internationally and look forward to building up our international program again starting with WU24UC.

An exciting addition to the SA calendar has been the inclusion of a university tournament, set to take place in July 2022. While he sport is not accredited in South Africa, Tshepo Thaela (SAFDA development officer) and other university students took it upon themselves to host the tournament as a way to bolster recognition in universities. This is a major step forward and we hope this will continue strengthening the youth divisions.

Overall, we're happy that we're back to playing ultimate, but we are needing to rebuild the formal, competitive aspect of the sport. This will take time, but the more tournaments we have the better we will become.

Remarks from Head of Africa Women in Sport Commission, Esther

The Women in Sport Commission (WSC) has a mandate to advise the WFDF Board of Directors on the development of policies related to promoting women in sport, coordinate efforts to increase participation of women in Flying Disc, develop ideas and initiatives to promote the role of women in Flying Disc, ensure adequate representation of women within WFDF governance structures, deliver advocacy on gender issues in Flying Disc and to be active in raising awareness about gender equity.

WFDF has programs to support initiatives that help develop disc sports globally. The <u>WFDF Development Grant Program</u> supports a broad range of projects including introduction of Flying Disc Sports into new countries,

gender inclusion projects, programs for SOTG education, youth programs, coaches training, anti-doping education and other areas.

A proposal titled <u>"Promote Women Participation in Ultimate"</u> that was submitted to WFDF by Esther Omuseni on behalf of Kisumu Frisbee Club was successful with funding received in January 2022. Plans towards execution of the project kicked off immediately. The first target of choice was Maseno University. Kisumu Frisbee Club led by Mercy Mbago reached out to the institution and managed to recruit a few girls to the sport. With a tournament planned by the national federation, the newly recruited eight girls (8) were sponsored to attend the Crying Stone tournament that was held in February 2022. Follow up visits are ongoing to ensure the recruited girls stay motivated and more girls are recruited to the sport.

With a tournament scheduled in April 2022, we hope to sponsor more newly recruited girls to this tournament to have them get the exposure and stay motivated to play the sport.

The next institution has been identified at a place called Chemelil and plans are ongoing to reach out to the group in May.

All the teams in Kenya have also been encouraged to partner with the project leader (Esther Omuseni) to support the project and reach outcross the country.

Spirit of the Game

AAFDF elected **Samir El Ajraoui** as the commissioner of Spirit of the Game (SOTG) and he has proposed the following goals to improve the use of SOTG in Africa:

- SOTG refreshes to all clubs, which can be done through monthly meetings.
- Each country can present or tell us about an experience related to the spirit of the game that took place during a sporting event or an organized tournament.
- We can invite club representatives to tell us how they were able to pass the Ultimate values on to their members and if they have encountered difficulties.
- Organize a special SOTG day for all African clubs through a gala match that focuses on the spirit of the game, during this day there may be tournaments if possible or a commemorative match with a slogan like SOTG EVERYWHERE.
- Another important point is to draw up a roadmap to translate the rules into all possible African languages and transmit in real time the latest updates to the rules of the game whether on the beach or on grass.

- We must be sure that Club leaders should always speak of the spirit of the game as the first and most important rule of Ultimate.
- In addition, Club leaders must talk about the importance of knowing the rules, and explain that it is the responsibility of each player.

Freestyle.

Yes, finally Africa is welcoming Freestyle. The first exhibition game was hosted in Cape Verde and now Nigeria. Thanks to Paul Kenny and Freestyle Play Association (FPA) who have been working tirelessly to shine freestyle touch around Africa. AAFDF and FPA are looking forward to encouraging more established disc associations to introduce Freestyle a long side Ultimate.

Goals

As we emerge out of COVID restrictions in many countries, it is important to ensure that NFs are adequately supported to restart frisbee activities. Players have been starved of playing time, but the emerging ultimate structures have been partially dismantled and membership is expected to drop as many players may not return to the sport. Thus, AAFDF has set the following goals:

- Effective distribution of discs throughout Africa. AAFDF is embarking on finding people who can transport and distribute discs. This usually comes in the form of American or European players visiting certain countries to work for their government or for NGOs. The challenge here is to establish contact with these people.
- Continued administrative support for countries willing to improve their WFDF membership. There
 exist a number of NFs who would like to become more established within WFDF and their own
 countries. AAFDF will continue supporting them.
- Effective SOTG training and support for NFs as we restart ultimate and other disc-related activities.
 Some communities have suffered due to a lack of continuity and the movement of their leaders.
 AAFDF wants to work with these people to rebuild what was hampered by COVID19.

Report from Ghana Flying Disc

THE Ghana Flying Disc Association in its second year of operation has been very active in Accra as well other parts of the country in its bid to promote the exciting disc sports to the country. During the past four months, in line with plans to spread the game in the country the GFDA has engaged numerous strategies including media campaign, hosting clinics, workshops and competitions and the commencement of our maiden Ultimate Frisbee league.

The aim of the GFDA is to make disc sports a house hold name in Ghana and as such we will continue with effort to ensure that the game reaches all groups within the country including the less privileged and girls.

ACTIVITIES AND MILESTONES FOR THE 1ST QUARTER OF 2022.

INTRODCUTION OF THE GAME AT THE UNIVERISTY

The official introduction of the disc sports game at our premier University and biggest University in Ghana which is the University of Ghana, Legon –Accra. After series of negotiations with the leadership of the University of Ghana, the GFDA has managed to officially introduce the game to institution. In line with plans to promote the game at the University, all the various halls will form clubs that will compete at the Inter-Halls competition which will be hosted annually. It is worthy to state that GFDA management has already managed to introduce the game to a section of student who have already started playing the game at the University. The official acceptance to the game by the sports directorate of the University has actually consolidated our efforts in that regards. Beyond the University of Ghana, initiatives have also been made to get the game introduced to 9 other universities that compete at the annual Ghana University Sports Association (GUSA) games. GFDA is highly hopeful that the introduction of the game at the University of Ghana will significantly boost our efforts to introduce disc sports in Ghana.

GFDA MAIDEN ULTIMATE FRISBEE LEAGUE

The commencement of the GFDA maiden Ultimate Frisbee league marks a very important milestone in the annals of the GFDA. The GFDA maiden league comprises of six (6) teams including La 1st Win Ultimate Club, Osu Ultimate Club, Nungua Ultimate Club, Fricks Ultimate Stars, Tema Ultimate Club and the Social Disc-Tance Ultimate Club made up of expatriate and experienced Ultimate players in Ghana. The league format is an all play all with the 2 top teams playing in the finals for the league trophy. The commencement of the league has given the youth a perfect platform to enjoy competitive

games whiles having fun and also showcase their talent in Ultimate. Additionally, the commencement of the league has also given our coaches the platform to access the performance of their players. Above all, the commencement of the league has also aided us in spreading the word about the arrival of Ultimate Frisbee in Ghana.

GFDA DISC GOLF PROJECT.

The commencement of the disc golf game in Ghana also marks a very important milestone for the organization. With its large international following, our project has already caught the eye of the disc golf community who has been very supportive of efforts to promote the game in Ghana. GFDA has hosted a number of competition and clinics for disc golf lover enthusiasts who are very interested in learning and playing the game. GFDA is planning to get get officially affiliated to the PDGA so that they can help us amplify our project, reach more people and impact more lives accordingly. In line with our overall disc sports project, we will also promote the disc golf in schools, communities and universities. GFDA has already introduced the game to a few schools including the St. Thomas Aquinas Senior High School in Accra Ghana. Plans are underway to promote the game to a few more within Accra and the other 5 regions where we operate.

GIRLS PARTICIPATION AGENDA.

The first quarter of 2022 has seen a slight and important increase in the number of girls' participation in disc sports games. Ultimate Frisbee has seem the highest t number of girls participation followed by disc golf. GFDA is of the view that our game is very likely to grow faster if we encourage and get more women to join in. In view of that we made serious efforts toward the participation of girls and this includes the introduction of the game to a number f girls schools within Gt. Accra region and the Eastern Region. It is our fervent hope that the number will keep rising as we keep introducing the game to more communities, schools, universities and other sectors of the public.

ENVIRNEMNETAL SUSTAINABILITY PROJECT.

GFDA is highly conscious of the fact that the environment is very essential to the survival of the human race including all our members and athletes. As part of our corporate social responsibilities we are working to plant trees and carry out activities to enhance our environment. In line with this, the organization has forged partnership with Nurture Nature Foundation to help keep the beaches along the coast of Accra clean, by engaging in constant beach cleaning activities. GFDA has been involved in five (5) different beach cleaning activities organized by the Nurture Nature Foundation at the James Town beach area in Accra. Whiles supporting in the cleaning of the beaches, members of GFDA also

informed the community members of the need to keep their environment and beaches clean at all times. These activities have largely contributed to efforts to ensure that the beaches are kept clean.

PLANS AND PROGRAMS.

THE GFDA immediate plan is to participate in the World Juvenile Ultimate Championship in Poland, expand our reach and scope in Ghana and also host the All African Ultimate Championship in Ghana in 2023. In line with these agenda, the organization has started negotiations with numerous stakeholders on different initiatives all aimed at ensuring that our plans materialize in the near future.

The GFDA National U20 team has started preparation for the championships in Poland and leadership is fervently working around the clock to ensure that the organization has enough resources to make sure these projects are succeffully implemented.

GFDA has also indicated its desire to host the 2022 All African Ultimate Championship in July 2023 and has accordingly sent in an initial bid to the WFDF. The organization has also formally informed the National Sports Authority of its intention for the needed support.





WFDF Congress August 2022 – written on June 19th, 2022

New EFDF statutes were voted during an extraordinary Congress in November 2021, and EFDF is now officially registered in Austria. A foundation Congress was held in January 2022, where a new board was elected for a two-year mandate.



- to develop ideas and initiatives to make sure that the Entourage serves in the best interest of athletes
- to ensure representation of the Entourage within the WFDF governance structures
- to promote WFDF rules and regulations concerning the Entourage within their domains
- to monitor and further develop the WFDF Guidelines for the Conduct of the Athletes' Entourage

World Flying Disc Federation Report to Congress 2022 - Flying Disc Parasports

The 2018 WFDF Congress has fully voted in the affirmative to intensify the work on Flying Disc Parasports at their meeting in Cincinnati in 2018. WFDF has secured the budget needed to follow-up on that decision and working within a sustainable structure. The projects are co-funded by the IOC development programme. During the Congress it was again confirmed that in several countries there are Wheelchair Ultimate initiatives running and that our member associations fully supported WFDF to lead the endeavours in that respect.

In 2019 the IPC underwent a governance review and restructure process, and this resulted I a change of the IPC strategies. IPC recognised IFs must now fulfil a larger set or requirements, namely international competition activity. Consequently, WFDF announced in our call for applications to host events that in 2023 the WFDF 2023 Inaugural World Wheelchair Ultimate Championships (WWUC) would be held.

The WFDF Parasports Commission in 2021 issued the edition 1 of the "Flying Disc Parasport Wheelchair Ultimate – Book 1". https://wfdf.sport/wp-content/uploads/2021/12/Wheelchair Ultimate.pdf

The present ebook is the next step in our process and establishes the first set of competition rules including the guidelines on venue layouts for Wheelchair Ultimate. And will greatly contribute to staging continental competitions in Wheelchair Ultimate in Europe, America, Asia/Oceania within the next working period. This will eventually lead to World Championships in the next 2-3 years.

We thank our partners at the International Paralympic Committee (IPC), International Wheelchair and Amputee Sport Federation (IWAS), and our scientific partners for their contribution. Our great thanks and appreciation go to the editor of the "Flying Disc Parasport Wheelchair Ultimate - BOOK 1" José Amoroso from Portugal who worked tirelessly on the project.


