EVENT DATES

The FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships (WFC) will be held over five (5) days, from Wednesday, 29 July to Sunday, 2 August 2026, as part of the Munich Frisbee Festival.

Athletes should plan to arrive in Munich on Tuesday, 28 July or earlier to allow sufficient time for registration, practice, and preparation.

LOCAL ORGANISING COMMITTEE

WFDF and FPA have appointed the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) to deliver the Freestyle Event as part of the Munich Frisbee Festival. The event is organized in cooperation between FLBY – Bavarian Flying Disc Association, the local freestyle and disc community in Munich, and experienced tournament directors from the German freestyle scene.

The LOC brings together organizers with extensive knowledge of freestyle, disc golf, DDC, and ultimate, as well as long-standing experience in hosting events, festivals, and community-based sports activities in Bavaria. Combined with the support of FPA and WFDF, the LOC aims to provide a world-class environment for athletes, while introducing flying disc sports to a wider audience through workshops, demonstrations, and family-friendly festival programming.

With a strong organizational foundation, dedicated teams, and deep local expertise, the Munich LOC is committed to delivering an outstanding championship that highlights the unique culture of freestyle and showcases Bavaria as a vibrant and welcoming host for international flying disc sport.

LOCATION

The FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships will take place in Munich, Germany, one of Europe's most iconic sporting cities. Known for its strong athletic culture, high-quality sports infrastructure, and vibrant public life, Munich provides an ideal setting for a world-class freestyle event.

Munich is the capital of Bavaria and home to more than 1.5 million residents. The city is internationally renowned for its blend of history, innovation, green spaces, and welcoming atmosphere. From historic architecture and cultural landmarks to modern facilities and easy transit connections, Munich offers an enjoyable and memorable experience for both athletes and visitors.

Located in the heart of southern Germany, Munich is easily accessible from across Europe and around the world. Direct flights connect Munich Airport (MUC) to major international hubs, while the regional public transport network ensures quick and convenient travel within the city and to nearby sports venues.

With its dynamic cultural scene, world-famous parks, and strong community engagement in sport, Munich provides the perfect stage for the Freestyle World Championships and the broader Munich Frisbee Festival.

VENUE

The Event will be hosted at the Sportschule Oberhaching, one of Bavaria's premier high-performance sports centres. Located just south of Munich, the complex provides modern facilities, excellent training conditions, and a professional environment perfectly suited for elite freestyle competition.

The venue is widely recognized as one of the most advanced multi-sport training centres in Germany. Built to international standards, it regularly hosts national teams, professional athletes, and high-level sporting events.

The venue layout will be detailed in Bulletin #2, together with warm-up zones, spectator access points, and festival activity areas.

As part of the Munich Frisbee Festival, additional spaces around the venue will host workshops, demonstrations, and public engagement activities organized by FLBY and local disc communities.

The Sportschule Oberhaching offers a safe, modern, and athlete-focused environment that will support a smooth and professional competition experience for all participants.

TRAVEL & TRANSPORT

Munich is one of Europe's best-connected cities, making travel to the FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships simple and convenient for athletes and guests from around the world.

By Air

Munich International Airport (MUC)

Munich Airport is Germany's second-largest aviation hub, offering direct flights to major destinations across Europe, North America, Asia, and the Middle East.

- Distance to venue: approx. 55 km
- Travel time to Oberhaching: 45–60 minutes by car or train

The airport features efficient public transit connections, multiple rental car services, and shuttle options.

Airport to Munich City / Oberhaching

From MUC, participants can easily reach the city centre or Oberhaching using:

- S-Bahn (S1 or S8) trains connecting directly to city centre
- Regional trains toward Deisenhofen / Holzkirchen
- Taxi / Uber / Bolt ride services
- Rental cars available at the airport terminal



By Train

Munich's Hauptbahnhof (Main Station) is a major European rail hub with high-speed ICE train connections from cities including Vienna, Zurich, Prague, Frankfurt, Berlin, and Paris. Oberhaching is connected to Munich via the S3 S-Bahn line, making it easy to reach the venue from any part of the city.

By Car

Athletes arriving by car can reach the venue via the A8 and A995 motorways.

- Parking is available near Sportschule Oberhaching

Local Transport

Munich has one of Europe's most reliable public transport systems (MVV), including S-Bahn, U-Bahn, Trams, Buses and City bikes (pay-as-you-go with credit card tap).

All systems support **contactless payment** (credit/debit card tap).

Ride-sharing services (Uber, Bolt) are widely available and convenient for groups. Please plan travel early, especially for arrivals on Tuesday and Wednesday.

CLIMATE

Munich in late July and early August offers warm, pleasant summer weather, ideal for both competition and outdoor activities surrounding the Munich Frisbee Festival.

Average daytime temperatures range between **23°C and 28°C (73°F-82°F)**, with cooler mornings and evenings around **16°C-18°C (61°F-64°F)**. Sunshine is common during this period, though short, occasional summer showers or thunderstorms may occur, typically in the late afternoon.

Humidity levels are moderate, and indoor conditions at the **Sportschule Oberhaching** remain stable and comfortable throughout the day.

Participants are advised to bring:

- Light athletic clothing suitable for warm summer temperatures
- A refillable water bottle
- A light jacket or hoodie for evenings
- Sunscreen for outdoor festival areas and transit

Overall, the climate provides excellent conditions for freestyle competition, training, and enjoying the cultural and recreational offerings of Munich.





ACCOMMODATION & FOOD

The information below provides a general overview of accommodation and food options available for athletes and guests attending the FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships. Additional details and recommendations will be provided in Bulletin #2 and through direct communication with registered players.

Accommodation

Participants may choose from a wide range of accommodation options in Munich and the surrounding area. The tournament venue, Sportschule Oberhaching, is located approximately 30 minutes south of Munich city centre and is easily accessible by public transport and car.

Recommended accommodation options include:

- Hotel at the venue location
Sportschule Oberhaching offers discounted hotel accommodation for players.
- Airbnb
A large selection of apartments and rooms is available in both central Munich and the Oberhaching area.
- Booking.com & Google Travel
Useful for comparing hotels, apartments, and hostels across different districts of Munich.

Please note that Munich is a popular summer destination. Early booking is strongly recommended, especially for arrivals between 28 July and 1 August.

Food & On-Site Amenities

A variety of food options are available in and around the venue:

- Venue dining hall / cafeteria
Sportschule Oberhaching features an on-site dining hall offering warm meals, snacks, and beverages throughout the day.
- Grocery / food stores nearby
Supermarkets and food stores close to the venue offer ready-made meals, snacks, and vegan or vegetarian options.

Participants are kindly asked to bring their own refillable water bottle to reduce plastic waste.

TOURNAMENT & COMPETITION OVERVIEW

The FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships is sanctioned jointly by the World Flying Disc Federation (WFDF) and the Freestyle Players Association (FPA).

The World Championship will be conducted in accordance with current WFDF and FPA freestyle rules, regulations, and judging standards. All athletes will compete under the same official ruleset, ensuring consistency and fairness across all divisions. All players must be a member in good standing with the FPA.

Divisions

Competition will take place over four (4) days, from Thursday to Sunday. The event will feature four official freestyle divisions:

- Open Pairs
- Women's Pairs
- Mixed Pairs
- Open Coop (3 players)

Competition will consist of semifinal and final rounds.

Depending on division size and registration numbers, additional rounds may be scheduled.

The exact competition format and advancement criteria will be confirmed and published in Bulletin #2.

All routines will be evaluated by certified freestyle judges using the official FPA judging system, in accordance with WFDF and FPA judging standards. Routine lengths are as follows:

- Pairs divisions: 3 minutes
- Open Coop division: 4 minutes

All registered competitors are expected to follow the published competition schedule, attend mandatory meetings, and comply with all event regulations, including WFDF Spirit of the Game principles.

Further competition-specific details, including division formats, judging procedures, and round structures, will be provided in the sections below and expanded in subsequent Bulletins.

JUDGING SYSTEM

The FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships will be judged using the official Freestyle Players Association (FPA) judging system, in accordance with current WFDF and FPA freestyle rules and regulations.

All routines will be evaluated by certified freestyle judges appointed by the event organizers and approved by WFDF and FPA. Judges will be selected based on their experience, certification status, and familiarity with the current judging system.

The judging system evaluates freestyle routines according to established criteria defined by the FPA, ensuring consistency, transparency, and fairness across all divisions and competition rounds.

Detailed information on judging categories, scoring methodology, and calculation of results will be provided in Bulletin #2 and during the official Players' Meeting prior to the start of competition.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Participation in the FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships is open only to athletes who meet the membership requirements of the Freestyle Players Association (FPA).

All competitors are required to hold a valid FPA membership for the 2026 season and be in good standing. Membership status must be fully paid and valid at the time of registration and throughout the competition.

Details regarding membership verification, deadlines, and any applicable exceptions will be provided during the registration process and outlined in Bulletin #2.

REGISTRATION

All athletes intending to compete must register for the event.

Registration is conducted online and opens in conjunction with the publication of this Bulletin. Athletes must complete registration using the official event registration link:

Only athletes who meet the membership requirements outlined above will be eligible to complete registration and participate in the championship.

Additional registration-related information, including procedures and required documentation, will be communicated as needed directly to registered participants and expanded in subsequent Bulletins.

FEES & EVENT DEADLINES

Participation in the FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships requires payment of an event registration fee.

The following registration fee categories apply:

- Player – early-bird (no players package): 65 €
- Player – early-bird (with players package): 90 €
- Player – regular (no players package): 70 €
- Player – regular (with players package): 95 €
- Guest Jammer – early-bird: 45 €
- Guest Jammer – regular: 50 €

Early-bird rates apply until 22 January 2026.

Late fees may apply after 1 July 2026.





The event registration fee contributes to the overall costs of organizing the championship and typically includes:

- Access to all official competition rounds
- Event organization and venue operations
- Participation in official championship activities
- Selected on-site services and event amenities

Key event deadlines are as follows:

- Registration deadline: 20 July 2026
- Payment deadline: Player Meeting (9:00 a.m., 30 July 2026)

Athletes are advised to complete registration and payment within the announced deadlines to ensure eligibility and to support effective event planning and logistics.

WORKSHOPS & PUBLIC PROGRAM

As part of the Munich Frisbee Festival, a multi-disciplinary Workshops & Public Program will be delivered alongside the FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships.

While this program is not formally part of the FPA and WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships, participation in workshops and other activities at the Frisbee Festival is strongly encouraged. The public program will include activities across several flying disc disciplines, each coordinated by dedicated discipline leads in cooperation with the Local Organizing Committee, WFDF, and FPA. Each program area will include a combination of workshops, demonstrations, and public-facing competitive or participatory activities.

Planned program areas include:

- Freestyle Flying Disc – workshops, demonstrations, and public competitions
- Disc Golf – introductory sessions, public competitions, and outreach activities
- Double Disc Court (DDC) – workshops and competitive activities
- Ultimate – public activities and competitive formats
- Wheelchair Ultimate – inclusive workshops and competitive activities

Overall coordination of the Workshops & Public Program will be provided by the Event Organizing Team in cooperation with FLBY and local flying disc organizations.

Detailed information regarding program content, schedules, locations, eligibility, and participation formats will be confirmed by the Local Organizing Committee and published in subsequent Bulletins.

SPIRIT OF THE GAME

The FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships will be conducted in accordance with the WFDF Spirit of the Game principles.

All participants are expected to demonstrate respect, fair play, integrity, and responsibility both on and off the competition floor. This includes respect toward fellow athletes, judges, officials, volunteers, event staff, and members of the public.

Athletes are responsible for knowing and following the rules of the competition and for conducting themselves in a manner that reflects the values of the flying disc community.

Unsportsmanlike behaviour, harassment, or conduct that undermines the Spirit of the Game may result in disciplinary action in accordance with WFDF and event regulations.

Further information regarding conduct expectations and any applicable procedures will be communicated to participants as needed.

HEALTH & MEDICAL

The health and safety of all event participants is a priority.

Basic first aid and medical assistance will be available on-site during official competition hours. WFDF and the Local Organising Committee (LOC) do not provide medical, travel or health insurance coverage beyond general first aid assistance provided at the venue.

All event participants (athletes, coaches, officials, volunteers, and accompanying persons) are strongly recommended to obtain adequate travel and health insurance prior to arrival. Insurance coverage should include training, competition, travel, and any potential medical treatment, including emergency or follow-up care at local medical facilities if required.

Participants who are residents of the European Union are reminded to travel with their valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).

Flying disc sports and international travel involve inherent risks. While on-site medical personnel will be available to assess injuries and provide first aid, participants may require additional medical treatment or hospital visits in the event of illness or injury.

WFDF and the LOC request that all participants acknowledge these risks and understand that WFDF and the LOC cannot be held liable for any risk, injury, illness, or cost associated with participation in the event. All event participants should alleviate some personal financial liability by purchasing your own travel and health insurance to make sure you are covered for any medical issues or event/travel cancellations that could arise. Participants are responsible for their own health and well-being throughout the championship.

All participants will be required to accept and sign an Event Participant Agreement, which will be published in advance of the event and form part of the registration process.

ANTI-DOPING

All event participants of the FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships, held as part of the Munich Frisbee Festival in Munich, Germany must comply with the provisions of the WFDF Anti-Doping Rules (as amended from time to time), the World Anti-Doping Code (the “Code”), and the International Standards issued by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), as published on WADA’s website.

It is required for every player to sign the Anti-Doping Declaration and to hold a current ADEL online Anti-Doping Education certificate (online link below).

Certification is valid for two (2) years.

WFDF is a signatory to the WADA Anti-Doping Code and therefore all WFDF events are subject to anti-doping testing, either in-competition or out-of-competition. Athletes must acknowledge the authority of WFDF and its member National Federations and/or National Anti-Doping Organizations to conduct testing, manage results, and impose sanctions in accordance with the WFDF Anti-Doping Rules and applicable regulations.

All players must review the information on anti-doping procedures and the WADA Prohibited Substances and Methods List, which can be found online at:

Any form of doping, as defined by the WADA Code, is strictly prohibited.

Course description:

This is the essential course for international-level athletes. This course includes ten (10) content modules, each addressing a specific topic related to anti-doping as specified in the Code:

- Welcome to clean sport
- An introduction to the anti-doping system
- Consequences of doping
- The rules
- A guide to the prohibited list
- Anti-doping and your health (TUEs)
- Supplements
- Understand testing
- Whereabouts essentials
- Speaking up: sharing concerns to protect clean sport
- Final quiz (mandatory) – athletes must pass the final quiz with a score of 80 or above to meet the course completion requirement.
- Learning experience survey (mandatory) – please complete the survey to help improve future content.

Recommended duration: approximately 3.5 hours (dependent on prior knowledge).

The course does not need to be completed in a single session and can be taken module by module, allowing participants to complete it over multiple sessions at their own pace.

WFDF fully supports the World Anti-Doping Agency's (WADA) position that the long-term solution to preventing doping lies in effective, values-based education programs that foster anti-doping behaviours and create a strong anti-doping culture. WFDF is committed to ensuring that athletes, coaches, and other support personnel have access to the knowledge they need to compete clean and to avoid committing an anti-doping rule violation due to a lack of awareness or understanding of the rules.

In 2025 alone, more than 6,500 athletes worldwide completed the ADEL Anti-Doping Education Program and obtained certification as part of their participation in WFDF-sanctioned events.

WADA Anti-Doping Education & Learning (ADEL) Platform

ADEL is a global anti-doping learning and education platform launched by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) to support the International Standard for Education. The platform provides education and learning opportunities for the global anti-doping community, including athletes, coaches, parents, medical professionals, and other support personnel. Users can access personalised learning plans based on their role or choose from a wide range of education courses and information resources.

Courses are available in multiple languages.

For users who prefer to learn on the go or who have limited internet access, the platform also offers the “ADEL by WADA” mobile app (available via the Apple App Store and Google Play), allowing courses to be downloaded and completed offline.

Users will need to register and create a username and password in order to access and enrol in learning opportunities.

ADEL Anti-Doping Education & Learning Platform – Participation Requirements

Registration and participation in WFDF-sanctioned Championships and Events requires the completion of, and proof of completion of, Anti-Doping Education.

- All competitors (athletes) are required to complete the [ADEL International-Level Athletes Education Program](#).

Certification is valid for two (2) years.



VISAS

We strongly encourage all teams and players to promptly check visa requirements for entry into Europe / Germany.

It is each participant's responsibility to secure the necessary documentation to compete at the WFC 2026. While FPA & WFDF cannot provide specific visa guidance, we highly recommend starting the process as early as possible.

Please note that we cannot and will not provide a formal "invitation" to attend the event and non-ability to enter Germany is not grounds to request a refund for player fees.

We recommend **EVERY PLAYER** makes specific inquiries to fully understand visa and travel requirements.

CANCELLATION / MODIFICATION POLICY

Be advised that the event may be forced to cancel by governmental orders or may be perceived to be unsafe and cancelled by the organisers.

LOC and WFDF are bound to adhere to the governmental agencies including Emergency Service Agents (Police, Fire, Ambulance and Health) as well as adhering to direction placed upon the event by local, regional and national government and venue owners. The organisers may be forced into a last-minute cancellation for the whole event or to make specific changes to venue or participating teams due to direction beyond their reasonable control.

Should changes need to occur due to factors outside our reasonable control, the event may be rescheduled, if possible. If a reschedule is not reasonably feasible, participants, teams and spectators may be unable to recoup any costs already expended for the cancelled event.

Each team/participant is strongly encouraged to consider purchasing insurance to cover the costs (travel/accommodations/etc.) as a result of any cancellation or rescheduling of the event by governmental authorities, the organisers, or others.

If any new information presents itself that would warrant an event cancellation or modification, we will report such changes as promptly as reasonably possible to teams/participants.



SECURITY POLICY

The Local Organising Committee (LOC) will provide general security for all teams/participants, venues, and event areas, following the recommendations and requirements of the local authorities. These measures are designed to ensure a safe and secure environment for all participants, staff and spectators throughout the Championship.

Teams/participants may review the security arrangements provided and may supplement them as they deem necessary. Any additional measures must be approved in advance by local authorities.

Delegations with extraordinary security needs - such as private security personnel, special protocols, or additional logistical requirements - will be responsible for organising and covering the associated costs. Teams/participants must notify the LOC well in advance of any such requirements to allow for coordination with the relevant local authorities and to ensure full compliance with local regulations.

COMMUNITY & VOLUNTEER INVOLVEMENT

The FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships is a community-driven event that relies on the involvement and support of athletes, volunteers, and accompanying participants. In addition to competitors, participants may attend the event together with friends, partners, or supporters who wish to be involved in the broader festival atmosphere or contribute as volunteers. Community involvement plays an important role in creating a welcoming, social, and well-organized event environment.

Volunteer and community support opportunities may include, but are not limited to:

- Division Directors (all competition days)
- International Committee Members (all competition days)
- Commentators for the live stream (Saturday and Sunday)
- Moderators for the on-site audience (primarily Saturday and Sunday)
- Workshop coaches for children (Saturday)
- Camera operators (all competition days)

Details regarding volunteer roles, participation options for accompanying persons, and community involvement opportunities will be provided during the registration process, where interested participants may indicate their interest via the registration form.



GENERAL INFORMATION

The official language of the FPA & WFDF 2026 World Freestyle Flying Disc Championships is English. All official communication, documentation, and announcements will be provided in English. Photography and video recording will take place during the event for promotional, media, and archival purposes. By participating in the championship, athletes and participants consent to the use of their image in official event communications and materials.

Participants are expected to comply with venue rules, local regulations, and any instructions provided by event staff throughout the event.

This Bulletin provides general information for planning purposes. Updates, clarifications, and additional details will be communicated through official WFDF and event communication channels and published in subsequent Bulletins.
