Education

WFDF firmly embodies WADA's motto of "an Athlete's first experience with anti-doping should be through education rather than Doping Control." To that regard, as part of the WFDF's Anti-Doping Education Plan, WFDF uses various tools to support this, including:

- WADA's Anti-Doping Education and Learning platform (ADEL)
- WADA's guides, checklists, factsheets and other resources

WFDF invites its Members and stakeholders to register on ADEL and complete various courses and access the different resources and tools, as well as collaborate with their National Anti-Doping Organizations (NADOs).

All International-Level Athletes and Athlete Support Personnel (i.e., coaches and medical staff) at all Sanctioned Championships are required to complete an anti-doping educational course relevant to the respective role that covers topics outlined in WADA's International Standard for Education, successfully pass its evaluation and submit the certificate as part of the registration process.

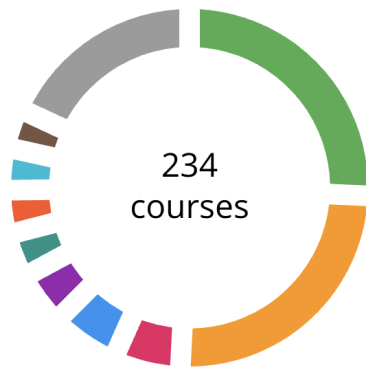

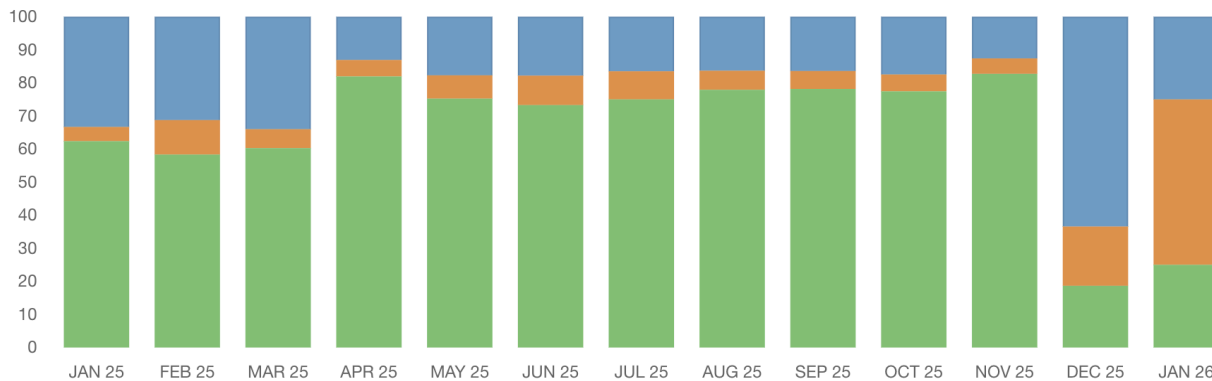
